
What to Bring:

- Labeled water bottles
- Feed your child a snack beforehand - none will be served during class at this time
- Diapers (if your child needs a diaper change during the service, we will contact you to come and do so yourself - this keeps things simple and safe!)

Outdoors

- There is a public playground and grassy area for all to use, just outside the auditorium.
- There are huge windows in the auditorium that we plan to keep open, weather permitting.
- If anyone is more comfortable sitting near the window / just outside by the window, please do so! We want you to attend and still participate in worship.

Classrooms

- We have two classrooms currently: Early Childhood for infants through 3s + PreK/K.
 - Eventually, we'd also like to add a classroom for 1st and 2nd graders.
 - For those in 3rd-5th grade, we will have sermon note pages for you to complete during the service and would love your participation in the Q&A!
 - We are partnering with Rocky Mountain Presbyterian to host a youth group for 6th-12th graders on Monday nights at RMPC.
 - All adult teachers have gone through training and a background check for safety. We ensure that no child is ever left alone with only one adult while in our care.

We will provide:

- Clipboards with crayons
- Coloring pages
- A worksheet for sermon notes
- An assortment of other items for your children to use / play with during the service as they participate with you.
